
# Welcome


### **IPAD OVERVIEW**



- 1. Front camera
- 2. ON/OFF/LOCK Button
- 3. Volume buttons
- 4. Home button/Touch ID
- 5. Rear camera
- 6. Headphone jack
- 7. Microphone

### **GETTING STARTED**

Press and hold the ON/OFF/LOCK button for 3 seconds. An Apple icon will appear and the iPad will start to power up.



#### **SIGN IN**

Press the Home Button at the bottom centre of the iPad to sign in and start your session.

After the iPad completes the signin process, you will see the Home Screen with rows of images. Using the pad of your finger, tap on iPad User Guide on the upper left of the screen to learn how to use the iPad.

# WHEN YOU'RE FINISHED USING THE IPAD

Sign Out

- From the Home Screen, swipe down from the black bar, top centre to access the lock screen.
- In the bottom right hand corner, there is a Sign Out button. Tap that button.
- The iPad will ask you if you are sure you want to end the session. Tap End Session. This will end your session and any information you put into the iPad will not be saved.



Or turn the iPad completely off. This will end the session for you.

Press and hold the ON/OFF/LOCK button until you see the "slide to power off" screen. Slide the white and red "power off" circle to the right, maintaining contact with the screen.
